INDIA PALE ALE

BY TWO FOOLS, BREWING

Ship of Fools, previously known as Garuda Brew, is a classic IPA in the Northwest style. Aggressive, high alpha-acid hops are used, along with a secondary fermentation dry-hopping, to impart the bitter and fruity hop flavor. Originally, IPAs were strongly hopped and considerably higher in alcohol than your average ale, so that it would survive the long sea voyage to British troops in India (Hops and high alcohol being hostile to contaminating bacterias).

The label art comes from a 15th century cautionary collection titled “Navis Stultifera” or Ship of Fools. Fools were often used to illustrate non-virtuous and sinful vices, such as hubris, greed, slovenliness, and gluttony in these volumes illustrated by woodcut prints such as the one above.
